Motorbike ride in tribute to husband

A WIDOW who lost her husband in a motorcycle accident has organised a memorial ride in his honour.

Dad-of-five Rob Mills was well-known among the North East's motorbiking community.

His family were devastated when the 48-year-old was hit by a car while out riding on the B6318 Military Road in Corbridge, Northumberland, in June, 2010.

Rob's wife Teresa, 48, of Aster Place, Fenham, set up Dying to Ride, a motorcycle awareness group that aims to save lives on the road.

The first Dying to Ride annual Fallen Riders Memorial will take place on Saturday, June 9.

The event will begin with a commemorative motorcycle ride, followed by a motorcycle awareness presentation.

The names of bikers who have lost their lives in accidents will then be read out during a memorial ceremony.

Museums take prizes in 2012 Visit England contest

TYNESIDE'S tourism industry has won national recognition in the 2012 Visit England awards.

The ceremony, which celebrates the best the country has to offer visitors, saw the Great North Museum grab gold in the Access for All Tourism category.

And taxi boss Alan Fidler received his Tourism Superstar award for the warm welcome his East Coast Tours company provides.

Mr Fidler, from North Shields, takes visitors around the region in the back of a cab and links up with ferry firm DFDS Seaways to put on top packages for overseas groups.

Helen White from the Great North Museum said: "We are delighted to have won this award, particularly as it is so important to be recognised at a national level alongside such prestigious organisations."

"Since we opened in 2009, the museum has gone from strength to strength with over 1.7 million visitors enjoying a variety of exhibitions and events. We

continue to strive to maintain the standards expected from our 'Great' name."

Sarah Stewart, chief executive at tourism body Newcastle Gateshead Initiative (NGI), was delighted with the amount of recognition Tyneside received and paid tribute to all the winners.
